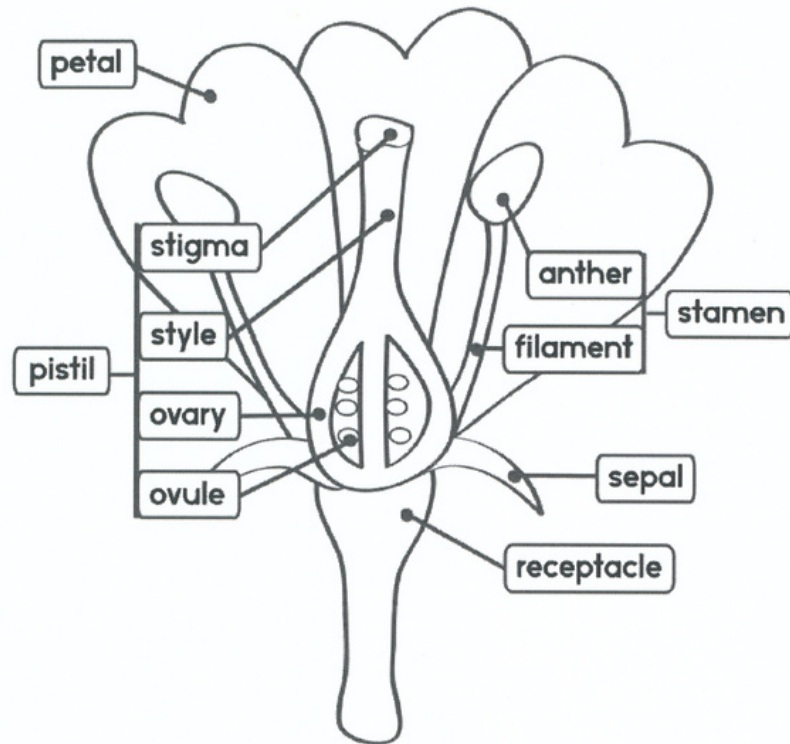


Parts of a Flower Dissection Activity
