A pollinator is an animal that moves pollen from one plant to another. This helps plants make fruit and seeds. Without pollinators, we wouldn't have things like sunflowers, apples, or strawberries!

WHERE DO POLLINATORS LIVE?

Flowers and plants make a sugary substance called nectar that pollinators love to eat. So pollinators like to live close to places that have lots of flowers and plants- like gardens! When pollinators go to eat a flower's nectar, they get pollen stuck on them and then carry it to the next flower they visit, which is how the pollen travels from flower to flower.
